“There are none so blind as those who will not see!” Nowhere is this indictment more evident than in this weekend’s Gospel story about Jesus, the blind man, and some Pharisees. We might imagine how impressed we might be if we saw someone cured on the spot of lifelong blindness. It’s almost irritating that the Pharisees are not moved by this impressive miracle of Jesus. What does it take to convince them that Jesus had divine approval? On the other hand, what does it take to impress any of us?

The rule is that we normally see what we want to see. “Reality” is basically what we choose to perceive. This means that, like the Pharisees, we have a talent for creating blind spots for ourselves. Blind spots prevent us from seeing the truth and affect the way we ascertain the “facts.” A mother, for example, rebukes her daughter, “Didn’t I tell you to be in by midnight?” The daughter responds with utter conviction, “You never told me that!” Blind spots about ourselves can be serious impediments to our growth and happiness; they can also keep us mired in problems and unnecessary pain. A frustrated wife urges her alcoholic husband, “Honey, you need help,” but he firmly insists, “Don’t worry, I have it under control.”

The Gospel is more than a reproach to Pharisees; it is an encouragement for us to be aware of our own blind spots. We must all strive to see more clearly. With a positive attitude in mind we can be more open to what we do not at first see or comprehend, rather than jealously defending our own little corner. The Gospel is a dynamic message leading us always towards the light of truth, which is our risen Lord. Getting there through the thickets of our prejudices, assumptions and misunderstandings is always a very humbling and certainly a very seasonal Lenten experience. Think about it!!

What Makes Marriage Work
Commitment and Common Values

Some ingredients, if missing, can doom a relationship from the start. Two are commitment and common values. Commitment bonds a couple together when you are tired, annoyed, or angry with each other. Sometimes, remembering your vows can

prompt you to push past these problems and try to forgive and start again.

Common values are important. If you aren't together on basic values such as children, honest fidelity and putting family before work, no amount of learning or effort of the will can resolve the conflict. For example, constant tension will result if one spouse wants to live simply, but the other wants life's luxuries.

RESPECT LIFE
March – 5th month

St. Mary's Respect Life Committee has placed the 5th "Little One" poster in the vestibule of the church. Our "Spiritually Adopted" babies are at the half-way point to being born. Babies at this gestational age have survived a premature birth. Yet these viable infants are at the mercy of outside forces – including their own mothers – as to whether they will live or die. Please continue to pray for your "adopted" Little One!

The following text is on the poster:

Fifth Month (size: about 12 inches)

This month marks the half-way point to birth, and the baby is very active. Sleep habits develop and his mother can feel him move and stretch, particularly when she is resting. He is big and strong enough to kick hard against the outside uterine wall and dent it. Up to now, although he swam with ease in his watery world, he was too small for her to detect because the outside wall of the uterus has no feeling. Babies born at this age have survived.

Good News: The End of Life Option Act (physician assisted suicide bill) in Maryland was withdrawn and the Senate hearing canceled. The bill will not be passed this year.

Praying is a powerful action we can all take. Here are some specific prayer intentions:

1. Pray that presidential cabinet appointments and Supreme Court appointments are people who will promote a culture of life in our nation.
2. Pray that all elected representatives will promote dignity for human life from conception until natural death.
